Students are invited to attend the Women in Politics virtual conference hosted by Oxford High School GDST on Friday 29th January 2021 from 11.00 to 15.50. This is a conference focussing on the challenges and successes of female politicians in their profession. The list of speakers includes; Layla Moran Lib Dem MP for Oxford West and Abingdon and their spokesperson on Foreign Affairs and International Development, Anneliese Dodds, Labour MP for Oxford East and Shadow Chancellor, Victoria Prentis, Conservative MP for Banbury and Parliamentary Under-Secretary of State for Farming, Fisheries and Food, Fleur Butler, National Chairman of the Conservatives Women Organisation. It will also include a video presentation from Baroness Scotland, former Labour Peer and Attorney-General and who is now Secretary-General of the Commonwealth.
